Read Romans 3:9-20

This study is going to be slightly different. Before we get to one of the greatest paragraphs ever written on earth, we need to summarise the long and carefully constructed argument of Romans 1:18 – 3:20, so that we are better able to get our minds around it.

Leaders Notes

1. The aim of this question is that people go over the verses we have covered in the last 5 weeks. In doing so, hopefully they will piece together Paul's argument. There are only four questions in this study, so take some time on this one. And let the truth of Scripture sink in and convict us all of our sin and need of God's salvation.
